

A Strategic Approach to Tariff Management Enhancing U.S.
Competitiveness

Foreign Trade Zones
(FTZs) are designated
areas within the United
States that are treated as
outside of U.S. Customs
and Border Protection
(CBP) territory for tariff
purposes.

These zones are located in or near CBP ports of entry and serve as the **U.S.**equivalent of free-trade zones.





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There is one FTZ located in **central New Mexico**, **FTZ #110**.

#### This FTZ covers:

- Bernalillo County
- Valencia County
- City of Santa Fe
- City of Rio Rancho
- City of Bernalillo
- City of Moriarty.

Its grantee is the City of Albuquerque **Aviation Department** 

### HOW Itworks

Tariffs are only assessed when **goods leave the FTZ** and enter the U.S. If the goods are exported outside the U.S. directly from the FTZ, no tariffs are paid at all.

Because FTZs are considered outside CBP territory, products stored or processed within them are not classified as imported, yet. This means tariffs are not immediately due, offering flexibility in how and when duties are paid.



#### enefits

Leveraging an FTZ can help your company:

- Optimize cash flow by deferring or eliminating duty payments
- Avoid duties on waste, scrap, defects, damaged, or obsolete goods
- Choose the lowest
   applicable duty rate,
   either for the imported
   components or the final
   product
- Reduce administrative burden through weekly inventory entries.

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Additionally, if your company performs manufacturing or processing within the zone and the product classification changes, you may benefit from a reduced or even duty-free rate, depending on the final classification.





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All activities within an FTZ must comply with U.S. laws and regulations and are subject to public interest review.

# SIDZO

To take advantage of FTZ benefits, your company can apply for an FTZ subzone, a designated area within a larger FTZ tailored specifically to your company's operational needs.
